

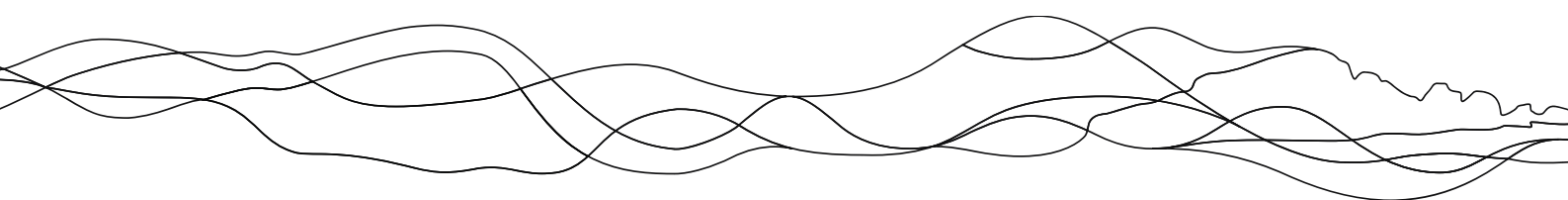


Sustainability and Travel in the South Downs National Park
