Tonbridge is well worth a visit, with great access to the countryside and many quaint little Kentish villages. Tonbridge providers access to many walking and cycling routes, and parkland, open water and of course the River Medway for all types of sporting activities. A short walk from the station, the castle remains dominate the High Street, built by William the Conqueror to keep the locals in check. The castle fields host many outdoor music events and exhibitions throughout the year. Historic Tonbridge school and the E M Foster theatre can be found at the top of the High Street. The town has links to Jane Austen, evident at St Peter's church, walking tours are available. There are many opportunities to stop and refuel at the town's many cafés, bars and restaurants or find a seat by the river and watch the world go by.



Famous artist

Explore the picturesque village of Tudely, just outside Tonbridge, with its little known jewel, All Saints Church. The only church in the world that has all its windows in stained glass by created by the famous Russian artist Marc Chagall. Walk or catch bus no 205 from the station.




About the **Southeast Communities Rail Partnership**


